## THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

## FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

Each NF is invited to enter athletes in each Championship. The 5 athletes can start in the Individual Championship, 4 athletes may start in the Team Championship.

The OC extends its invitation to one Chef d' Equipe per NF, who will be provided with similar privileges as the athletes.

Each athlete may ride 1 horse only. No reserve horse may be brought to the Championship. A NF that cannot send a team, may send 1 or 2 individual, with one horse each.

One groom per athlete maximum.

### **QUALIFICATIONS**

#### **ATHLETE**

NF are responsible to ensure that their athletes are of the appropriate age.

The <u>Children Championship</u> is open to athletes from the beginning of the calendar of the year in which they reach the age of 12 until the end of calendar year in which they reach the age of 14.

The <u>Junior Championship</u> is open to athletes from the beginning of the calendar of the year in which they reach the age of 14 until the end of calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.

The **Young Rider Championship** is open to athletes from the beginning of the calendar of the year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of calendar year in which they reach the age of 21.

### **HORSES**

Horses must be 7 years of age or older for Juniors and Young Riders. 6 years old for the Children Championships.

Horses competing in the Junior Championship cannot have competed in a Nation Cup or Grand Prix competition at a CSIO for Senior in the current year. (Annex IX, art.15.1.1,1.2&1.3)

Horses competing in the Children Championship cannot have competed in a Nation Cup or Grand Prix competition at a CSIO for Senior in the current year or/in the previous year. (Annex XII, Art. 21.1.2&1.3).

Athletes are invited by the Organising Committee through their NF. One groom per athlete.





FEI JRs, Annex IX: The Chefs d' Equipe are responsible for the behaviour of their teams and/or individuals throughout the Event. They and their NF are responsible for any damages that occur. If the Athletes are not lodged in private homes the Chefs d' Equipe must stay with their teams and/or individuals.





## **VII. ENTRIES**

All Athletes & Horses participating in any International competition must be registered with the FEI, prior to participating. Failure to do so will result in automatic disqualification of the Athlete and/or Horse.

Entries in Principle: 20.06.2014

Each NF must declare whether they intend to participate with a team or with individual competitors.

Nominated Entries: 23.06.2014

Each NF may enter a maximum of 10 athletes and 10 horses per category. Each NF must Return to the FEI by 23<sup>rd</sup> of June one certificate of capability per category with all nominated Championship athletes and horses included duly signed by the President of the NF.

Definite Entries: 08.07.2014

Each NF may enter a maximum of 5 athletes and 5 horses or up to 2 individual athletes with **1** horse each. All athletes and horses must be chosen from the list of nominated entries.

Last date for substitutions: 21.07.2014 - by h. 7 pm

Minimum Eligibility Requirements and Certificates of Capability.

**For the Junior and Young Rider Championships**: in order to be eligible to be included on the list of Nominated Entries, all athletes and horses must have achieved the Minimum Eligibility Requirements and must strictly follow the qualification procedure as published on the FEI Website. The deadline for achieving the Minimum Eligibility Requirements is:

22.06.2014

**For Children, Junior and Young Rider Championships**, Jumping nominated entries must be made via the FEI Online Entry System.

Following the completion of the Nominated Entries, NF must complete the Certificate of Capability online (1 Certificate per category per NF, to include all Championship Athletes and Horses). Once the Certificate is completed it must be printed, signed by the President of the NF and submitted to the FEI Jumping Dep. (to marijn.dubbeldam@fei.org). Nominated Entries must be completed and Certificates of Capability must be submitted to the FEI by:

23.06.2014





**For Junior and Young riders Championships:** it is necessary to submit Records of Results for each athlete and horse. Please note that it is not necessary for Athletes and Horses to achieve their Minimum Eligibility Requirements as a combination. Following the completion of the Nominated Entries, the FEI will check and approve the eligibility of all nominated Athletes and Horses. Definite Entries can only be made from approved eligible Athletes and Horses on the Nominates Entry list. However athletes or horses that have qualified via a special qualifying competition need to complete the Record of Results and submit this to the FEI along with the Certificate of Capability.

The Record of Results will be available to download on the same page as the Certificate of Capability.

**For the Children Championship:** Records of Results are not necessary as there is no Minimum Eligibility Requirement. However the Certificate of Capability must be submitted as above.

### 14. STEWARDING

The following policy is effective as of  $\underline{1}$  July  $\underline{2014}$ :

- If an athlete is uncertain as to whether the boots he/she intends to use during an event are allowed, he/she or his/her representative should show the boots to the Chief Steward for his/her opinion before the boots are used in training or in competition.
- In addition, athletes are to be made aware that hind boots must be removed and placed again on the horse's legs in the presence of a Steward while in the warm-up arena prior to entering the competition arena for certain competitions. (If bandages are used in place of boots, athletes are not required to remove the bandages in the warm-up arena.) This procedure is compulsory for competitions for which boot and bandage control is mandatory, that is the Nations Cup, Grand Prix, and the competition with the highest prize money, and is at the discretion of the Chief Steward for other competitions.
- As an alternative to carrying out this procedure at the time designated by the Steward an athlete may ask his/her groom to take the boots to the in-gate and place them on the horse's legs in front of the Steward prior to the combination entering the arena.
- The Steward has the authority to intervene if a boot is deemed excessively tight by instructing that the boot be removed and put on again correctly. [Stewards are to note that it is normal for a horse's gait to be somewhat affected immediately after boots have been removed and re-placed.] If an athlete or his/her groom refuses to remove and re-place the boot(s) when instructed to do so by the Steward, a Yellow Warning Card will be issued to the athlete in question.
- · If it is deemed impossible or unsafe to remove the hind boots in the warm-up arena prior to the combination entering the competition arena, due to an extremely excited or nervous horse, the boots of the horse in question are to be removed by the athlete/groom following the athlete's round upon leaving the arena and inspected by the Steward. This inspection may be carried out during the boot and bandage control if the boot and bandage control is carried out for the competition in question.
- This procedure does not replace boot and bandage control after completion of an athlete's round for competitions for which boot and bandage control is mandatory (refer to JRs Art. 244.1).

# 2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

### **GENERAL**

In accordance with the FEI Code of Conduct it is imperative that all Horses at FEI Events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.

### **ENTRY OF HORSES**

### 3. NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

All participating horses must be in possession of:

- 1) a declaration (with a detailed list) from their own NF stating that the same is temporarily imported into Italy to take part in FEI CH EU Ch, J and YR 2014 in AREZZO;
- 2) an ATA form, especially for extra European Countries or in the case the horse will pass through not EU Countries (crossing not communitarian nations) (for further information see: <a href="http://www.atacarnet.com/">http://www.atacarnet.com/</a>);
- 3) official veterinary health certificates on the International Form issued from the official veterinary health authorities of the Country of origin
- a) for horses from European Countries see Annex B of Council Directive 1990/426 EC and subsequent amendment (please remember that this Annex B still in force only 10 days);
- b) for horses from NOT European Countries see Council Directive 1992/260 EC and Commission Decision 2004/211 EC and respective subsequent amendment.

## 4. TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in vehicles suitable for the transport of horses. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, and the Horse be in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have a responsibility to be in compliance of national legislation in both the country of origin, return, and the host nation of the Event; where necessary Athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

# For all Horses FEI Passports/FEI Recognition Cards issues, please address to your National Federation

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards - for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI, are compulsory for FEI Events, with the exception of CNs and CIMs as outlined below.

Athletes whose Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card is not correctly validated, or failing to meet other passport requirements including for vaccination and Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication control (Veterinary Regulations Article 1030) will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex II of the Veterinary Regulations** and may not be allowed to compete.

Athletes will be required to write their name and counter sign next to any passport irregularity entry noted, as an acknowledgement, prior to receiving the passport and leaving the show ground. Following a warning being issued for such an irregularity the Athlete will have 30 days to correct this, failure to correct such irregularities within 30 days will result in a sanction being imposed.

Note for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union, all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations, to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

# VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA 2014 Veterinary Regulations Article 1028

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

Exceptions to the requirement for FEI equine influenza vaccinations currently exist only for those Horses competing at CNs or CIMs where there are no national requirements for influenza vaccination in both the Event host country and the Horse's country of origin (General Regulations Article 137).





# EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL 2014 Veterinary Regulations Article 1032

On arrival at an Event venue all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport, their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status, with regards to vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

# HORSE INSPECTIONS 2014 Veterinary Regulations Article 1033

All Horses will be assessed for their orthopaedic fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit not to compete will be eliminated by the Ground Jury and not be permitted to continue in the competition.

### LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION

Horses are not eligible to compete when a limb, or part of a limb, is hyposensitive or hypersensitive (both of which shall constitute "abnormal limb sensitivity"). Hypersensitive limbs have an excessive or abnormal reaction to palpation. Hyposensitive limbs include any alteration in sensitivity induced by a neurectomy or chemical desensitisation for as long as the alteration in sensitivity persists.

All Horses are subject to Examination under the Protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the Period of an Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event.

Horses may be selected for Examination under the Protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the Examination or are subject to immediate Disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

# 6. <u>EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION</u> 2014 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VI EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP)

Within FEI Groups I & II, the Organising Committee should charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 towards the cost of the EADCMP, which is affected by the FEI Veterinary Department.

## **SAMPLING**

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of FEI Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures (2013 Veterinary Regulations Article 1057 and 1058).





## **CLEAN SPORT INFORMATION**

The current FEI Equine Prohibited Substances List of Banned Substances and Controlled Medications (the EPSL) is available on the FEI Clean Sport website: <a href="www.FEICleanSport.org">www.FEICleanSport.org</a> as a PDF document, database or smart phone app. Detection times are also provided for a limited number of Controlled Medication substances where available.

### 7. PONIES

For all Pony Events, Ponies must be available for Pony Measurement prior to the Horse Inspection and throughout the event be subject to the requirements of the 2014 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter IV).





## 8. INJURY SURVEILLANCE

Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; such information is essential to ensure that (i) the Horse's welfare remains paramount at all times and (ii) sound scientific reasoning is applied to the safety of all Horses and Athletes participating at Events.





## XI. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

At a minimum, and pursuant to the ADRHAs, Organisers must provide the following at Events where human anti-doping testing is scheduled to take place at least 2 months prior to the Event:

- **1**. One (1) staff member able to act as point of contact and coordinator for the *Doping Control Officers* (*DCOs*) with the contact name and details of this staff member to be communicated to the *FEI* at least two (2) weeks prior to the starting date of the *Event*.
- **2.** Human anti-doping facilities reasonably separated from public activity, consisting of:
- one (1) private room exclusively dedicated for use by the *DCOs* with one (1) table, two (2) chairs, pens and paper and one (1) lockable fridge; and
- a waiting room/area with a suitable number of chairs as well as an appropriate amount of individually sealed, non-caffeinated and non alcoholic beverages, which includes a mix of natural mineral water and soft drinks; and
- one (1) private and clean bathroom/toilet, adjacent or as near as possible to the *DCO* room and waiting area.
- **3.** Staff members (or volunteers) of both genders, able to act as *Chaperones*. The number of *Chaperones* available to the *OC* must be communicated to the *FEI* as early as possible following receipt by the *OC* of the *Testing* plan for the *Event*. Please see the qualifications for Chaperones in the ADRHAs.





## XII. COMPETITIONS
